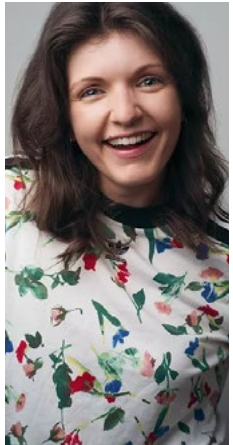




THE HURLINGHAM FESTIVAL

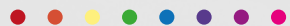

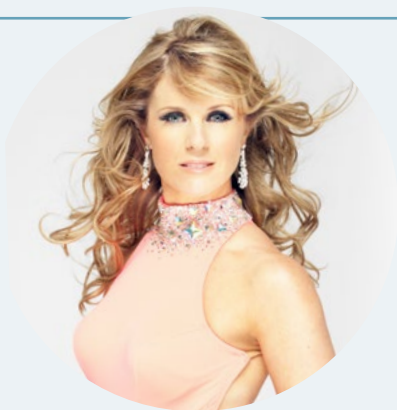

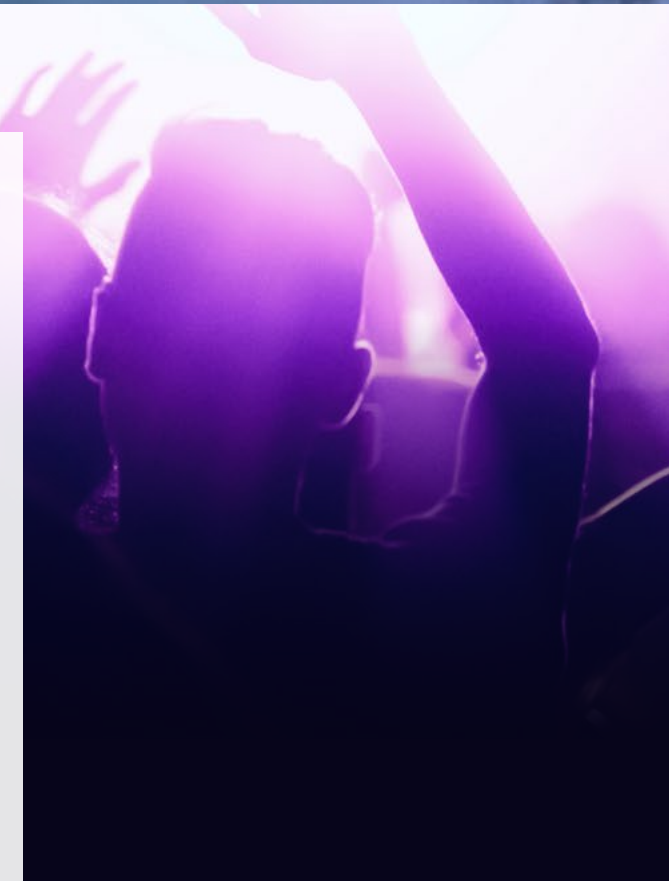
